About the role of Trustee

We are seeking to broaden the skill set and diversity of our Board to enhance our collective governance capabilities. We are looking for experts in their respective fields who can demonstrate a collaborative approach, sound judgment, strategic thinking, and give an active commitment to the vision and core values of the Gallery.

Trustees are responsible for:

- Ensuring that the Gallery works within, and furthers, its charitable objectives
- Shaping, overseeing and contributing to the Gallery's strategic direction, financial management and governance
- Ensuring that the Gallery has effective governance structures that are adhered to, in line with charity and company law obligations
- Ensuring financial sustainability, accountability and robust financial management of the Gallery
- Championing the Gallery's work by supporting its activities, and developing networks within wider communities
- Engaging in the Gallery's work, acting as ambassadors, and broadening the Gallery's reach and impact, and offering additional resource as and when available
- Acting as a sounding board and critical support for both the Executive and Senior Management Teams
- Actively supporting the Chair and the Director in the delivery and development of the Director's vision.



About the candidates

We looking for candidates who bring deep and broad experience of one or more of the following areas:

- Artistic or photographic practice (emerging careers and/or established practitioners)
- Arts education
- Finance
- Income generation (development, fundraising, trusts and foundations, sponsorship)
- Governance in the charity or cultural sector
- Community and local arts, with connections to the Soho and Oxford Street area

We are looking for people who can demonstrate some or all of the following:

- Successful experience of working in a charitable, public sector or commercial organisation
- Sound, independent judgement and the confidence to participate in debate about key strategic issues and know when to challenge constructively
- The ability to work supportively with other Trustees, advisers and senior colleagues to high ethical and professional standard and in line with legal responsibilities
- Effective communication skills
- A track record of creating inclusivity and diversity in the arts including insight/commitment to, and experience of, anti-racism and equity, diversity and inclusion
- Experience and understanding of the commercial elements within an arts organisation including recognition and support of our enterprises – print sales, bookshop and café
- The capability and people skills to take on an ambassadorial role for the Gallery
- A commitment to transformational change, learning, improvement and performance
- A passion for the arts and photography and their power to transform lives.
- A commitment to the values, vision and strategic objectives of the Gallery





Terms of appointment

Length of appointment

• Trustees are appointed for an initial term of three years, with the option to be re-elected for a one further term of three years.

Time commitment

- The role of Trustee requires a time commitment of two to three calendar days each month.
- The Board meets every quarter, including a yearly Annual General Meeting.
- Trustees are expected to attend exhibition openings and other important Gallery events.

Remuneration

• The post of Trustee is voluntary and reasonable expenses will be reimbursed in line with Gallery guidelines.

Location

• Board meetings are held in person at The Photographers' Gallery in central London, with the option to dial in if in-person attendance is not possible.



Governance and structure

The Photographers' Gallery is proud to be an Arts Council England National Portfolio Organisation.

Our Board is led by the Chair and comprises 6 to 12 trustees, some of whom serve on other committees, including:

- Finance & General Purposes Committee
- Nominations Committee

The Director of the Gallery reports to the Chair. Working closely with the Executive Management Team, the Director delivers the Gallery's business plan to achieve the overall vision.

We also appoint two emerging career trustees as part of our wider commitment to support and develop future creators.
