The carabinieri, military policemen, wear black uniforms, white shirt and tie, with a peaked cap and a white leather belt worn diagonally across the chest. One stands facing us, his hands folded, while the other is in profile, turned to watch the prisoners.

Gaetano Fidanzati was born in 1935, the same year as Letizia Battaglia, and died in 2013. He was a Sicilian mafia boss, heavily involved in drug trafficking.
